My parents also organized a great evening for farmers from around Lucky Lake, Beechy and Birsay who were able to come out and hear about and support this great initiative. # Staying behind

Many of you will know that our family has really struggled to find viable education options for our children. Without teacher volunteers over the last two years and with poor internet, online schooling for our older children has become both challenging and frustrating. We knew that we would need to find a way to give the boys the quality education they need in order to leverage the gifts and talents they have. We want them to be equipped for their future service of the Lord. in whatever way He calls them. During our time here we have decided to keep the older two boys, Kenneth and Albert, at a Christian school attached to our church called MEI (Mennonite



Educational Institute). The boys will be staying with close friends, Rich and Nancy Balzer, who are also my cousins. Rich teaches at the school and they had offered (before we even asked) to keep any of our kids in Canada in order to attend school. After much thought and consultation and prayer we have decided to leave the boys behind to finish their high school. We plan to bring them home to Uganda for Spring break in March, so we will be apart for about 3.5 months to start with. This is not an easy decision, but we believe the boys will be able to develop their skills and talents in a Kingdom atmosphere with great oversight from teachers and Rich and Nancy. Of course, we will miss them tremendously as a family but it we believe this is the right thing to do. Please pray for us all during this time of great transition. The boys are excited but mom and dad are not looking forward to the separation.

#### Mpola mpola

"Mpola mpola" is a Luganda phrase which means "take it slowly". We plan to get going slowly as we re-enter work and life back in Uganda. Uganda life, is very busy and intense for us, involving continual interaction with local people and our many friends and family. We will take December to re-connect with Equip Colleagues, Farming God's Way trainers, our farmers in Wante and Bukenke as well as our friends and family around Uganda. It will be the tail end of the growing season so there will be no pressure to get out to farmers for training. January will get busy quickly with a number of Farming God's Way regional events planned and farmer training and follow-up to add to the "to do" list.

Anna, Ezra and Isaiah will be going to local homeschool co-ops in the Jinja area. This will mean daily commutes to and from school (about 10km+ each way) and Alin will be the only one at home ②. These are big changes for us and mean that we will need to restructure our work schedules. It will be a blessing to have the kids in an organized school environment full time.



## Please continue to pray with us in the following areas:

- ➤ Please pray that our travels back to Uganda will go well. For the first time we will have three flights, not the usual two, back to Uganda. Please pray that we will make all of our connections and that all of our luggage will make the same flights we do! Praise God for safe travels during our Saskatchewan tour thanks for keeping our travels in your prayers!
- Please pray for a missionary family, the Browns, who lost their dad (49 years). They are from the UK and ministered in Kampala under New Hope Uganda. They have four children. The loss is devastating!
- Praise for education solutions! We have come to the decision to leave our older boys back in Canada to continue schooling here and to put our younger kids in local homeschool co-ops in Jinja. Pray for our family as we will be apart from the older boys for longer periods of time now.
- Praise for more supporters! A number of people have committed to monthly support which helps our support levels for sure. Continue to pray that our support level would come up. We have had only three months this last year that were above our monthly donation target.
- Pray for peace in Kenya through their second election in two months (Oct 28th) and the fall-out from that. Pray for peace in Uganda as a series of ritual murders have swept the central part of the country. Tensions are also high as the government considers amending the constitution to allow for Presidential age limits to be removed. People here often debate politics with violence! Pray for cool heads to prevail.
- > Thanks for all your prayers! They are essential to our life here!
